

Walk in the Light

"This is the message we have heard from him and declare to you: God is light; in him, there is no darkness at all. If we claim to have fellowship with him yet walk in the darkness, we lie and do not live by the truth. But if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus, his Son, purifies us from all sin." (1 John 1:5-7)

Jesus also said, "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness but will have the light of life." (John 8:12)

The concept of light is a powerful and recurring theme throughout the Bible. To walk with Jesus is to walk in the light, and this light illuminates our path, guiding us in righteousness. Without the light of God, we cannot fully understand how to live our lives according to His will.

Living in darkness is incompatible with walking in the light. If we desire to walk with God, we must turn away from darkness and embrace His light. The passage from 1 John highlights two key blessings of walking in the light. First, it enables us to have true fellowship with one another—cultivating love, understanding, and unity in our relationships. Second, the blood of Jesus purifies us from all sin, restoring our relationship with God.

Walking in the light ensures that we maintain both a right relationship with others and a right relationship with God.

These two relationships—horizontal with humankind and vertical with God—are the foundation of a life rooted in faith.

It is noteworthy that studies on death and dying suggest that as people reach near the end of their lives, they seek reconciliation with God and their loved ones. This reminds us of what truly matters: living in the light of Christ each day.

As we prepare for changes in our church community through the Church of Scotland's reforms, I encourage you to remain steadfast in your faith. Though Haggs Parish Church will soon close and unite with Denny Old, we trust in God's plan for our united congregation. He will guide us as we continue to serve and worship together.

I encourage you to stay on the new church roll and to support our future United Church: Denny Old and Haggs United Church with your time, talents, and resources for the glory of God.

During this Lenten season, take time to reflect on your walk with God. Are there areas of darkness in your life that need His light? Surrender them to Christ and allow His light to lead you forward. May His light guide us all as we continue our journey of faith. **Amen.**

MOVING FORWARD TOGETHER

The move towards Haggs and Denny Old Churches forming a union in the summer is now well under way.

A joint Kirk Session meeting was held at the beginning of February with representatives from the Presbytery of Forth Valley and Clydesdale. Both sessions voted unanimously to accept the 'Basis of Union', as stated in Phase 1. of the Presbytery Mission Plan and to proceed towards forming a union between our churches by the end of June 2025.

Denny Old will then become the main Worship Centre.

Haggs Church will close, after 185 years of Christian service to the community of Haggs and Banknock.

Haggs Church Hall will be retained for community and missional activities until the final plan outcome of a Single Unite Charge occurs, then the position will be reviewed.

The name of our new church will be 'Denny Old and Haggs United Church of Scotland'.

We will retain Rev Raheel Arif as our minister and the business of the united church will be governed by one Kirk Session. All elders will continue to administer pastoral duties to members.

Everyone on the Congregational Rolls of both churches will have the opportunity to vote on this plan on **Sunday** 13th **April**, following morning services, when we hope as many people as possible will attend to cast their votes for this important change. If anyone is not a member but attends, they need to complete a form before the meeting to be allowed to vote.

This will be the first step towards us moving towards one central place of worship for the whole Denny, Haggs, Dunipace and Bonnybridge area as the next stage of the Mission Plan.

Any change can be frightening and unsettling but hopefully this union will be the beginning of an exciting new chapter for Denny Old and Haggs folk as we move forward together to strengthen and increase the work if Christ in our area.

What an opportunity to build a strong Christian legacy for our children, grandchildren and great-grandchildren into the future!

Gift Aid It



What is Gift Aid?

This is a government scheme which allows the congregation (as a registered charity) to reclaim the tax you have already paid on the money you give in your offering.

How does the church benefit?

While the basic rate of Income Tax is 20%, the congregation can recover the tax at the rate of 25%- e.g. £4 becomes £5

£20 becomes £25

£40 becomes £50

Who can give through Gift Aid?

Anyone who pays **Income Tax** or Capital Gains Tax which is annually at least equal to the tax which the congregation and other charities to which you make Gift Aid donations will reclaim on your gifts for that year.

What is Required?

Sign a Gift Aid Declaration- this is printed in the church magazineready for you to complete. Hand this to your elder or anyone on door duty on a Sunday or you can call Jean Duff, Gift Aid Convenor, on 01324 824768 and she will come and collect the completed form.

Give your offering using Offering Envelopes or by Bank Standing Order or by Cheque - to provide the Church with the necessary records of your giving.

You Do Not Need:

- To Promise to give a particular amount
- To promise to give for a specific period

Boost your donation by 25p of Giff Aid for every £1 you donate. Gift Aid is reclaimed from the government by charities from the tax you pay for the relevant tax year. The Driving Force



The Driving Force is a charity which takes anyone who has cancer and is registered with a GP in Banknock, Bonnybridge or Denny to hospital appoints for free.

Local volunteers work together to fundraise, co-ordinate and drive cancer patients to and from hospital appointments and treatment sessions. Kidney dialysis patients also benefit from this service. There are three types of volunteers – drivers, co-ordinators and fundraisers.

Drivers can volunteer to give as much time as they wish. While some drivers offer their car and services 5 days a week, Monday to Friday, many offer to drive 2 days or some 1 day.

Co-ordinators volunteer on a rota system and arrange a driver for each patient's journey and contact the patient with their driver's details. They contact the GP surgery daily to pick up the messages left by the patients.

Fundraisers are very important to help with raising funds through coffee mornings, prize bingo, etc.

Haggs Church supports the Driving Force regularly with proceeds from Soup and Sandwich lunches etc. being donated to the charity. Three members of our congregation volunteer as drivers and 1 volunteer as a co-ordinator. If you, or someone you know requires the services of the Driving Force please contact your GP surgery and leave your name and phone number and the on-call co-ordinator will contact you for your requirements. The Facebook page, The Driving Force, is a good way to find out more about the charity.

Volunteers would be delighted to come and speak to groups of people about the service and to raise awareness of this worthwhile charity. There will be a "Grand Raffle" prior to Christmas with fantastic prizes to be won. Please support this if you can.
